
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ABOUT THE CITY

Welcome to our city! Mexico City is enormous, and it's the second city in Latin America with the most museums. In this guide you will find all the information you need to know about the neighborhoods to visit, museums, places of interest, mobility options, hotspots, as well as the principal coworking spaces to make your stay even more valuable.



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MUSEUMS

A colourful and incredible country, it should come as no surprise that Mexico is rich in cultural spaces where visitors can experience and interact with art of every genre and from every time period.

Suffice it to say, no trip to Mexico would be complete without visiting at least one of its incredible museums that are absolutely worth seeing.

The Soumaya

The Soumaya Museum has a unique modern architecture. The museum's collection includes Mexican art from the 19th and 20th centuries and an extensive collection of old masters of modern Western art such as Rodin & Dalí.

Jumex

The Jumex Museum, one of the newest in the city. If you are a lover of Latin American art collections, you have to visit it.

Muac (contemporary Art)

One of the great distinctive things about this museum is that it is set in the volcanic landscape of the Pedregal de San Ángel. It also has a restaurant with a contemporary architectural space. The architect Teodoro González de León is also recognized by the Rufino Tamayo Museum & for co-designing the National Auditorium.

Chapultepec Castle

The historic Chapultepec Castle, built in 1785, is one of the city's premier museums. Besides its impressive architecture, it has been of vital importance in the country's history. As one of the highest points in the city, it's the most important scenic overlook in the metropolis.

Museum of Anthropology

This museum is the most visited in all of Mexico, a must-see for visitors from all over the world. The style of the architecture of this museum refers to the open forums of the Mayan ceremonial centers, referring to pre-Hispanic symbols.

Rufino Tamayo

This is the first museum built with private funds. It usually houses some of the most important contemporary art exhibitions to be seen in the city. You can also find works collected by its founder, artist Rufino Tamayo.

Memory & Tolerance

In Mexico City's central alameda, this is a museum that aims to open your eyes to empathy. It focuses on the consequences of indifference, discrimination, and violence throughout the history of humanity, and is an important icon to the cultural offerings of the city.

Palacio de Bellas Artes

This is one of the most outstanding buildings in the country and has been for decades. It has a museum inside and is the headquarters of the National Theater Company. It has a lot to see and learn.

Banco de México

This museum is located inside of main building of the Banco de México. You will learn step by step about the functions of the country's central bank and much more.

Munal

This museum has an impressive neoclassical building that was founded in 1982 and focuses on the exhibition, study, and dissemination of Mexican and international art. Its permanent collection contains more than 3,000 works.

Mural Diego Rivera

This museum often goes unnoticed among the many world-class museums in Mexico City. Here is the mural Sueño de una tarde dominical en la Alameda Central. It also has work from the 20th century, and has exhibited photography, painting, graphics, and sculptures.

Frida Kahlo Casa Azul

The famous Casa Azul competes every year with the National Museum of Anthropology for the title of “most visited museum” in Mexico City. The property belonged to the Kahlo family since 1904 and four years after the Frida’s death, it became a museum. This place was a meeting point for many of the outstanding personalities who met with Diego Rivera and Frida Kahlo.

Trick Eye

Trick Eye is a museum that, thanks to its 3D Art, makes two-dimensional images look like three-dimensional ones, creating an optical illusion. It is the first museum in the world that applies Augmented Reality technology on 3D Art.

Templo Mayor

Next to the Metropolitan Cathedral you can find this is museum of Aztec ruins and Aztec history in the Zócalo.

Zocalo Mexico City

The Zócalo is Mexico City’s main square. It includes the National Palace (a government building) and the Metropolitan Cathedral, symbol of the city, which is free to enter.

You can also have a drink at the “Balcón del Zócalo” or in “El Gran Hotel de la Ciudad de México).




MOBILITY

Metro CDMX

This is the principal mobility option in Mexico City. It has 12 service lines that run through different points of the city from Monday to Friday from 5:00 am to 12:00 am, Saturdays from 6:00 am to 12:00 am, Sundays and holidays from 7:00 am to 12:00 am.

Currently, the cost of the ticket per trip is \$5.00 MXN. The service also allows you to purchase a prepaid mobility card valid for use on the metro, metrobus, and ecobici on which you can charge the balance at the corresponding ticket offices or machines in the metro facilities.

It is important to mention that the first carriages are usually intended for women and children during the most congested hours.

IN CASE OF AN EARTHQUAKE

Mexico is in a seismic zone. To track real-time updates, you can check out the official Twitter account of the National Seismological Service (@SSNMexico)

In the event of an earthquake, the authorities recommend:

Before the earthquake...

- Locate the evacuation routes of the buildings you visit. These are marked with signs in green color.
- Prepare and simulate, together with your family, the evacuation of your hotel, locating lower risk areas where they can take shelter in case they cannot leave.
- Pack an emergency backpack and keep it in an easily accessible place. It should contain:
 - A USB with your most important digitized documents (residence cards, passport, rental contract or proof of ownership, medical insurance, birth certificates).
 - Medicines in case of having any chronic illness.
 - A first-aid kit
- Prepare a plan with your family or companions to agree on a meeting point in case you lose communication.

After the earthquake...

- In case an earthquake of strong magnitude is identified, a seismic alert will sound a few seconds before the movement is perceived.
- Follow the instructions of the authorities or follow the evacuation route you previously located. If you can't get out, go to the lowest risk area, which is also marked on the buildings.
- In case of having affectations, report them as soon as possible to the emergency telephones or seek help immediately.

General Tips

- Use safe transportation and avoid lonely places.
- If you get lost, stay calm and ask a nearby police officer or someone inside established shops about the destination you are going to. Mexico City has open internet at many points. You can connect to it, or we recommend downloading your map on Google Maps before leaving your hotel.
- Tips in restaurants and establishments: In Mexico City, it's common to leave between 10% and 15% of the cost of the service received in restaurants and food services in general. With packers in the supermarket or staff at gas stations, the most usual is to leave a tip of 10 to 12 pesos.
